

## Format Specifications for Honors Theses

In order to facilitate the binding and cataloging of honors theses for the Archives and Special Collections Department of the Dickinson College Library, the following guidelines shall be observed:

- 1) The top, bottom, and right hand margins shall be one inch, and the left margin shall be one and one quarter inches.
- 2) The thesis shall be fully paginated, including any forwards, prefaces, appendices, and bibliographies. Page numbers shall be centered approximately one half inch from the bottom of each page.
- 3) The title page of the thesis shall include the full title, author, date of submission, department for which the thesis is being submitted, the name of the thesis supervisor, and any designated readers of the thesis, as applicable. [An example of a properly constructed title page appears below.]
- 4) The thesis shall be printed on acid-free paper, obtainable through the College Service Center.
- 5) Additional copies of the thesis may be bound at the request of the academic department or the student. Academic departments should send appropriate internal requisition forms, along with the additional printed copies of the thesis, to facilitate the payment for these additional binding services.
- 6) If students are interested in making their honors papers available online, or if students have honors projects that, because of their multi-media content are better presented online rather than in traditional print format, please contact Jim Gerencser, College Archivist, to discuss online archiving and presentation options.
